COST OF LIVING

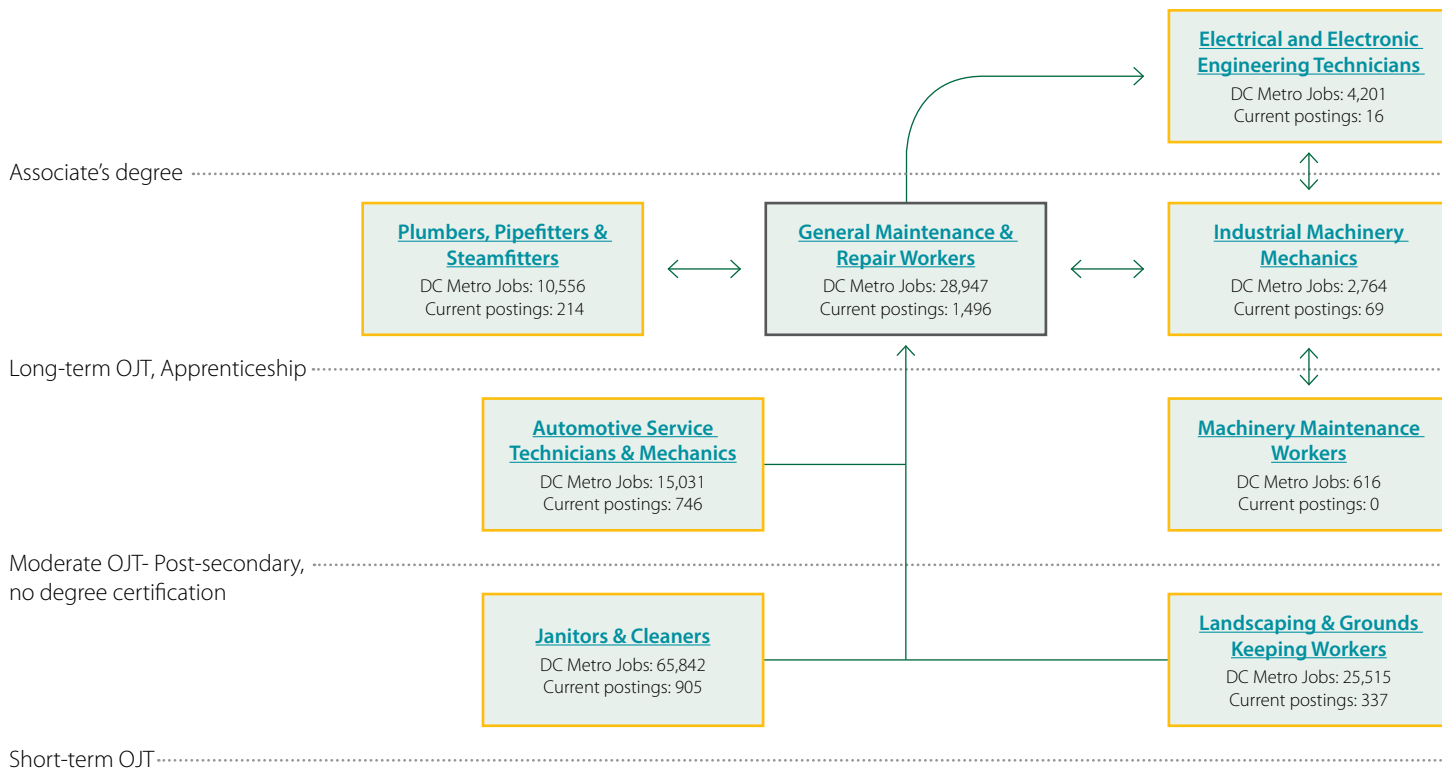

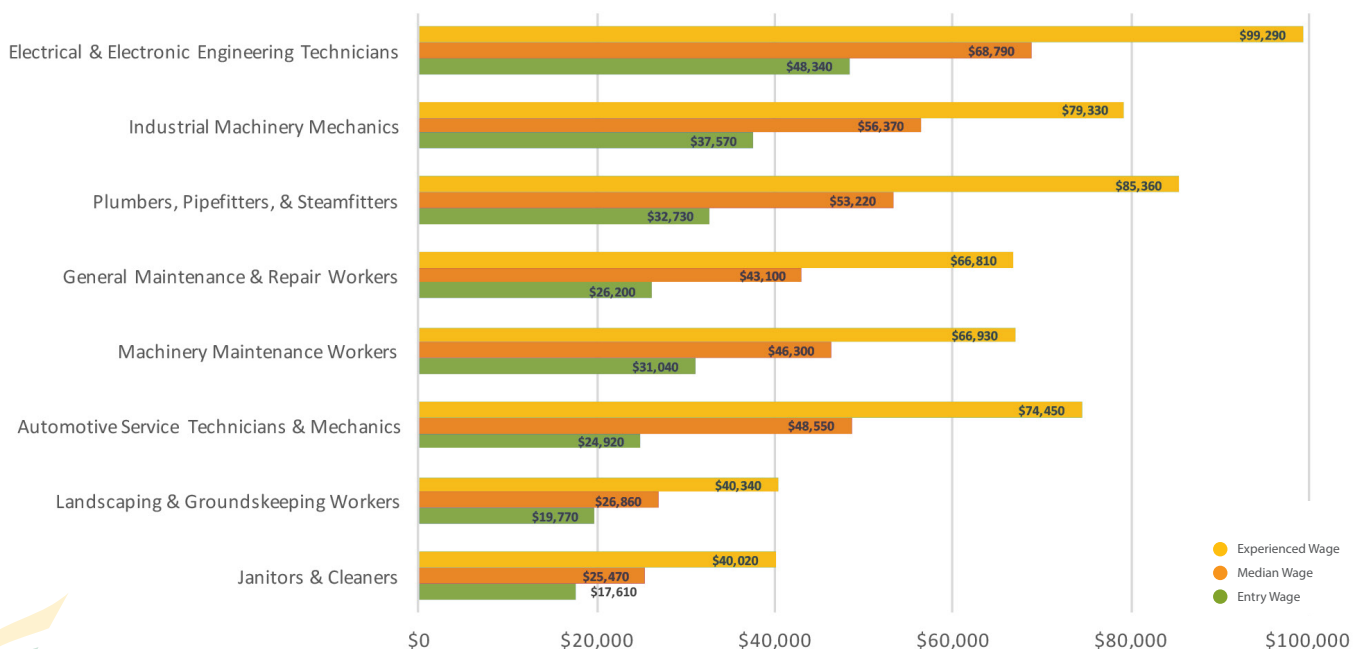
